Introduction to Districting

Districting Process

Step	Description
Two Initial Hearings April 17 & 29	Held prior to release of draft maps. Education and to solicit input on the composition of districts.
Community Forum April 22 – 6 PM	Public Education / Opportunity for feedback Monrovia High School
Release draft maps	Maps must be posted at least 7 days prior to 3 rd hearing.
Community Forum May 16 – 10 AM	Public Education / Opportunity for feedback Zoom
Two hearings on draft maps May 15 & 22	Two meetings to discuss and revise the draft maps and to discuss the election sequence.
Community Forum May 20 – 6 PM	Public Education / Opportunity for feedback Monrovia High School
Map Selection May 22 or 28	Map selected and a County Committee petition filed via resolution. Final map must be posted at least 7 days prior to adoption.
County Committee Hearing and Vote	County Committee on School District Organization holds a hearing and holds a final vote on the District's transition and map.



Districting Rules and Goals

1. Federal Laws

Equal Population
Federal Voting Rights Act
No Racial Gerrymandering



2. California Criteria

In prioritized order:

- 1. Geographically contiguous
- Avoid division of neighborhoods and "communities of interest" (Socio-economic geographic areas that should be kept together)
- 3. Avoid division of Cities and Census Designated Places
- 4. Easily identifiable boundaries
- 5. Compact (Do not bypass one group of people to get to a more distant group of people)

2. California Prohibition

"Shall not adopt election district boundaries for the purpose of favoring or discriminating against an incumbent, political candidate, or political party."

Future population growth








Protected Class CVAP



There are no large geographic concentrations of Latinos, Asian-Americans, African-Americans or Native Americans in the school district.


